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Lego Derby Regulations

Start thinking about how you want to design your Lego race car. The Pack will provide you the vehicle frame and wheels for you to build your Lego car. You are free to design your car and add a mini-fig driver as you desire, as long as they are within the below rules. Wheeled bases will be provided at the October Pack Meeting. If you cannot make the October Pack meeting, please reach out to your Den Leader.

Lego Derby Regulations:

- 1. Scouts must build the derby cars, with adult assistance as required.
- 2. The car must use the official MiniBrick Derby wheels and axles.
- 3. Cars shall be build using only Lego, Mega Blocks, or compatible bricks. Kits available \$6 cash
- 4. Max. length: 7 inches.
- 5. Max. width: 3 inches.
- 6. No bricks can extend below the wheeled platform
- 7. Max. Weight: 6.5 ounces
- 8. Max height 8 inches

If you missed the Oct. Pack meeting, Lego Derby frames will be available for pick up Wednesday 11/06, 6-7 PM at the Parish Center.
