Saturday, April 26th is our annual Raingutter Regatta at the Oak Grove picnic area in the Brecksville Reservation. Each scout will shape and decorate their boat. Propulsion for the race will be by each scout blowing through a straw onto the boat sail, racing from one end of the gutter to the other.

Raingutter Regatta Rules

- You must use all the pieces in the provided kit.
- You cannot add weights to your sailboat.
- Only the sail from the provided kit can be used.
- The sail must be mounted on the mast using the holes provided in the sail.
- The actual race will be divided into rank categories: Lion, Tiger, Wolf, Bear, Webelos, and AOL. There will also be a Pack Champion race.

- Family & Reverence the name of this adventure varies by Den but focuses on nonsectarian religious family traditions.
- Personal Safety watching the "Protect Yourself" video and engage in the related discussion points.
