REQUIREMENTS:

- All parents staying overnight must have a current YPT certificate on file. If it has been over two years since you last took the training, an update is required. Visit <u>my.scouting.org</u> > My Training.
- Medical forms no older than 13 months at the time of the campout must be on file with Pack 652 for all attendees (scouts, siblings, guardians) - day trippers and overnighters.
- Pack and national dues must be paid.



Loyalty is the feeling of strong affection or faithfulness we have toward our family, friends, country, or causes in which we believe.

This means we keep our promises and that we do what we say. We take care of the people we love and stand up for the people we care about. We support their decisions and show them love and respect, even when we disagree with them. We don't have to like or believe in all the same things to be loyal to someone (we can support different sports teams or like different subjects at school).

When you are loyal, people feel they can trust you and that you won't betray them – even if you disagree with them. If you're loyal to another person and trust them, you can talk to each other about your differences and develop a deeper understanding of that person and create an even stronger relationship.

A Scout is reverent toward God. A Scout is faithful in their religious beliefs and respects the beliefs of others. The Scout Oath begins with duty to God, and the Scout Law ends with reverence.
