### Lego Derby

The annual LEGO Derby is taking place on Saturday, November 8<sup>that</sup> the Parish Center. Kits were handed out at the October Pack Meeting. If you couldn't make the meeting, kits will be available at the November den meetings. Siblings and parents can by a kit for \$10.

### Lego Derby Rules (for Scout & Sibling Races) Weight limit update

- Must not exceed 5 ounces. The official race scale that is used at car check-in shall be considered final.
- The overall length of the car shall not exceed the Lego Derby base.
- The overall width of the car shall not exceed the wheels.
- The car must have 3/8" clearance underneath the body so it does not rub on the track.
- You must use the Lego Derby base and wheels. No replacement "speed wheels" are allowed.
- Only authentic Lego pieces allowed.
- Only dry powdered graphite is permitted. No oils or other lubricants are allowed.
- The car must be free-wheeling with no starting devices.

#### **OUTLAW RACE:**

Outlaw racers have a weight limit of 6oz and can use non-Lego parts, but must use provided Lego base, wheels, axles. All other rules apply.

#### WEIGH-IN:

Scales will be available to check weight of cars at the Nov. 5th den meetings. Official weigh-in will be day of races starting at 8:30 AM. No changes can be made to cars after weigh-in, and car is submitted for racing.
