Aquatics Day

Saturday, January 3rd is Aquatics Day. This event will begin 11:00 AM to 1:00 PM at the Brecksville Community Center. This event is included in your Pack dues. Please ensure your Cub Scout is onsite and ready to swim at 11AM. Locker rooms are available.

Most Scouts will be asked to put their face in the water so goggles and hair ties are recommended.

During the first hour Scouts will work in their dens to review basic water safety according to their age level and corresponding adventure requirements. Siblings are asked to stay out of the pool during this time.

In the second hour, Scouts, along with their siblings and parents, will be invited for free swim and to play and use the water slides. Pack 652 will have private access to the pool until 1:00 PM, at which time the pack event will be concluded and the pool will be open to all community center members and their guests.

Pinewood Derby - Race Details

Race Workshop

If you need access to tool to help shape your Scouts pinewood derby car, you are welcome to stop by the Maher Residence on Saturday, January 3, from 3:00 to 5:00 PM. See GroupMe for address. Please bring your car kit.

Race Check-in

To ensure all cars meet regulations, all racers need to check their cars in during one of the two weigh-in date/time options in advance of race day. There is no weigh-in day of the race. Be advised that you will NOT receive your car back after weigh in so please ensure it is 100% completed, including all decorating and with your assigned race car number. Your car will be returned after the races.

Pinewood Derby Rules

- The car weight shall not exceed 5.0 ounces.
- The overall length of the car shall not exceed 7 inches.
- The overall width of the car shall not exceed 2 $\frac{3}{4}$ inches.
- The maximum height of the car cannot exceed 5 inches (or the height of the finish gate).
- The car shall be made from the materials provided in the kit, including the wheels and axles.
- The car shall not ride on springs, bearings, washers, bushings, or any other device that gives it an advantage.
- The car must be free-wheeling, with no starting devices.
- Only dry lubricants are permitted.


